
## **CEEMC 2022 (Budapest)**

## Winning Team's Report (University of Ljubljana)

The three of us - Žana Lapajne, Masha Korošec and Nika Podakar – are students at the Faculty of Law at the University of Ljubljana. We had the opportunity to participate at the Central and Eastern Europe Moot Competition (CEEMC) in Budapest that took place between 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> May 2022. As the winners of the 2022 competition, we received a funded prize which enabled us to visit London and Cambridge in December 2022. This prize, and the CEEMC as a whole, was kindly funded by sponsorship provided by <u>Clifford Chance (Warsaw)</u>, the <u>European Investment Bank</u> and <u>Inner Temple</u>. Our visit began in in London, where we stayed at accommodation which was surrounded by various bars, so we had a chance to experience the varied and colourful London nightlife. Christmas was certainly in the air! We then visited the UK's Supreme Court and had the pleasure of meeting Lord Richards of Camberwell, one of the Justices of the Court. Lord Richards was called to the Bar at Inner Temple, after studying at Trinity College, Cambridge.
